MAYOR'S REPORT:

1. Sewer Collection system presentation will be done today by D&B presentation.
2. Garbage cans please don't use the large receptacles anything over 32 gallons is not permitted. Everything must go into a garbage can. We've already given out a lot of tickets for this.
3. We are working toward a new well at 503 Bayberry but the contractor that was digging the well, has requested a driving permit because the site needs to be manned 24 hours from FINS, which they denied so the contractor is no longer going to drill the well. Drainage line was installed on the east side of Bayberry all the way to Main Street and a system will be installed and joined to the drainage line. At the same time the Village will install a drain. This will not get rid of the water it will just move it. A question was asked about the contractor why we cannot accommodate the well digger in Ocean Beach? We are working on his terms.
4. We've been having some people driving around with lifetime medical bicycle permit on their golf carts. We do not and have never issued lifetime permits for golf carts, so please do not use them for that purpose.

Public Hearing Notes:

Ken Gray spoke and explained that there was a window in which municipalities can opt out of the retail sales of cannabis. Andrew Waz made a comment with respect to this matter. Trustee Norris re-iterated the intent of the law. Mr. Lyons owner of Seasonal Cannabis spoke and gave his opinion on the mis-information about the many aspects of this type of business. He spoke in favor of allowing the sales in Ocean Beach. Additional comments were made by the public.

LOCAL LAW 04 OF 2021 TO ADOPT CHAPTER 70 – CANNABIS PROHIBITION): Resolution No. 2021-092: Mayor Mallott moved as follows:

WHEREAS, the New York State Legislature has recently adopted the New York State “Cannabis Law” which legalizes the retail sale and consumption of cannabis under certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, such Act prohibits such retail sale and/or consumption of cannabis without a license from the State; and

WHEREAS, such Act further provides that no license may be issued for such retail sale and/or consumption within a village that adopts a local law, subject to permissive referendum governed by section twenty-four of the municipal home rule law, requesting the State not to grant such a license;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED, by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Ocean Beach, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 70, entitled “Cannabis Prohibition,” shall hereby be replaced as follows:

§70-1 – Legislative Intent. It is the intent of this local law to opt the Village of Ocean Beach out of hosting retail cannabis dispensaries and/or on-site cannabis consumption establishments within its boundaries.

§70-2 – Authority. This local law is adopted pursuant to Cannabis Law § 131, which expressly authorizes villages to opt-out of allowing retail cannabis dispensaries and/or on-site cannabis consumption establishments to locate and operate within their boundaries.

§70-3 – Local Cannabis Retail Dispensary and/or On-Site Consumption Opt-Out. The Board of Trustees of the Village of Ocean Beach hereby opts-out of licensing and establishing cannabis retail dispensaries and/or cannabis on-site consumption establishments within its boundaries. Furthermore, the Village of Ocean Beach hereby requests that the State of New York (and/or the NYS Cannabis Control Board and/or any other governmental agency authorized to issue such license) prohibit the establishment of any retail dispensary and/or on-site consumption by refusing to grant any such license (which would otherwise permit the sale and/or consumption of cannabis) within the Village of Ocean Beach.

§70-4 – Severability. If a court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court’s order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

§70-5 – Effective Date. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State, subject to the citizens’ right to seek a permissive referendum pursuant to the provisions of General Municipal Law § 24.

Section 2. This local law is determined to be a TYPE II action under the NY State Environmental Quality Review Act (“SEQRA”).

Section 3. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Office of the Secretary of State.
